Current financial reporting requirements/practice with Chief & Council and PDG:

- PDG *is not legally required* to report with consolidated, audited financial statements to membership as it is classified as a "closely held" corporation (one shareholder).
- C&C has no current legal obligation to report "own source revenues" to membership

As a result, a voluntary and selective practice is being utilized for reporting PDG matters. The current reporting practice of making overly broad statements is misleading and inappropriate due to their lack of substantive detail. **The official narrative is far from complete.**

The narrow legal perspective that permits this non-GAAP reporting for PDG *must be and can be* addressed via our own constitution. Compliance with GAAP reporting with C&C is also critically important.

Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP, partial list)

- **Transparency:** GAAP ensures *full* disclosure of relevant financial details, *which promotes transparency* and helps stakeholders have confidence in the reported information.
- **Audit framework:** GAAP provides auditors with a *standardized framework* to follow, ensuring that financial statements are prepared and presented fairly and accurately.
- **Reduced risk:** Adhering to GAAP helps *reduce the risk of data misrepresentation and fraud* by providing a transparent and accountable reporting structure.

Due to current non-GAAP reporting practice we have no voice

- We can change this by creating and implementing our own constitution laws for us, by us. Supreme laws of our nation that will bind current and all future Councils.
- This will take some time to create and implement.
- In the interim we need strong and clear policy that will address the reporting issue(s).
- Membership must assert its voice as the owners of PDG as per our Snawayalth

This leads to two questions for current Board of Directors (C&C):

- 1. When are we going to have an AGM for PDG in which consolidated, audited financial statements will be presented to membership?
- 2. How will we allocate PDG profits? How much to:
 - (1) Reinvestment in PDG?
 - (2) community projects?
 - (3) distribution to membership?

Implementing our own constitution will provide our voice with proper standing; compliance with GAAP will properly structure PDG financial reporting as well as C&C's, thereby further strengthening our voice.




