

STATUS REGISTRATION FOR NEWBORN CHILDREN

- You can register your baby for a status card at the same time you apply for registration under the Indian Act.
- The process involves filling out an application, proving lineage to a registered parent or ancestor, and providing necessary documents.

STEP 1: APPLY FOR BIRTH CERTIFICATE

- Birth Certificate
 Registration can be done online or paper options.
- •B.C.'s Vital Statistics provides parents registering newborn children with a quick, easy, and secure way to register online and also register for:
- Canada Child Benefits (CCB)
- Social Insurance Number (SIN)
- Medical Services Plan (MSP)

STEP 2: DETERMINE ELIGIBILITY

- •Eligitability: Your child can be registered if at least one of their parents is registered or entitled to be registered under the Indian Act. (LONG FORM BIRTH CERTIFICATE IS REQUIRED)
- •If it applies: Confirm lineage.
 You will need to prove
 lineage, which includes
 providing proof of paternity
 and status of the registered
 parent.



STEP 3: APPLICATIONS

- •Apply for both at once: You can apply for both Registration and a Secure Certificate of Indian Status (SCIS) if you are not yet registered.
- Obtain the application form:
 Get the application form
 online, by mail, by email, or in
 person from a regional office or
 your First Nations office.
 (Photos are needed)
- Fill out the form: Complete the application form and gather all required supporting documents.



STEP 4: SUBMIT APPLICATION

- •Submit the completed application: Send the form and all supporting documents to the appropriate office.
- Use a guarantor: If required, have a guarantor complete the necessary declaration to confirm your child's identity.



STEP 5: PROCESSING

Processing time:

Registration under the Indian Act can take up to two years. The status card application can take 8 to 12 weeks, after registration is complete.

•Receive the status card:
Once the application is processed, you will receive your child's secure status card in the mail.
